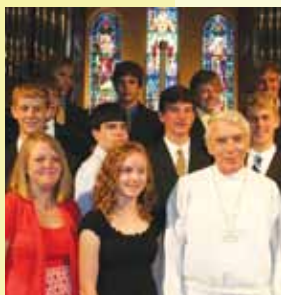

# GOALS

## 2011 STEWARDSHIP GOAL

**Our goal for the 2011 ministry year is to raise stewardship support of approximately \$1,200,000, allowing us to carry out the regular ministry work of the church.**

Gifts donated to *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* for general ministry will be used to help further our regular ministry programs, including: staffing, missions, small groups, worship and music, and youth ministry.

The Vestry asks that you seek the Lord and His guidance about your level of general ministry support for 2011. Additional stewardship details are available on pages five and six.

Help us continue to reinvigorate our family and youth ministries, outreach, music, education and fellowship programs that make St. Andrew's so special.

## RESTORATION PROJECT GOAL

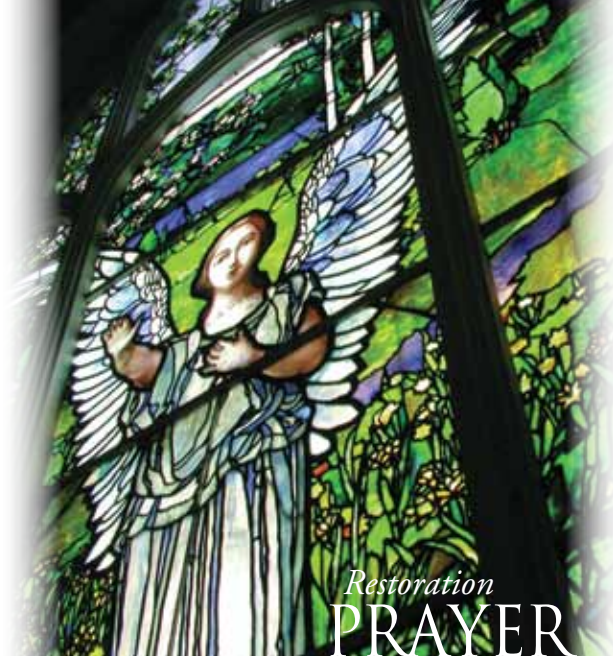
*November 2010-November 2012*

**The goal of the restoration effort is to raise \$1.25 million over two years, enabling us to complete our four-part restoration plan.**

Our current facility has been home to St. Andrew's for nearly 60 years, with the most recent major renovation taking place more than 35 years ago. Years of Midwest weather have battered the exterior and used up the life of our roof, and ongoing flooding of the lower level has left water stains on interior walls. And after 35 years of heavy use, virtually every area of the building needs attention. It's time to bring our facility back to its original glory!

Therefore, our objective is to restore our facility so that we will be well positioned to minister the Gospel in our community for the next 100 years. In two years time, with God's help, we envision finishing all the restoration projects identified in this brochure. Additional restoration details are available on page seven. We acknowledge that another capital campaign may occur in conjunction with our 100th anniversary that is more mission-minded in focus; however, that is a decision for a later time after our leadership transition is complete. For now, we are focusing solely on what we know needs to be accomplished to complete long overdue deferred maintenance on our facility.

Each family is asked to prayerfully consider giving at least 3 to 5 percent of its annual income each year for the next two years for restoration. Funds given to the restoration effort will be sacrificial gifts above and beyond giving to the general ministry fund of the church.

## *A Journey of Faith*

Ann and I celebrated our 20th wedding anniversary this year. It's been an incredible journey together – filled with joy, surprise, setback, failure, blessing, illness, healing, new life and nearly every other experience you can imagine. And, as the saying goes, I wouldn't have missed it for the world.

I think the greatest and holiest work we do usually takes the form of a journey. And true journeys — like our careers, our relationships, our child-rearing — rarely follow precise and definitive itineraries. They're works in progress, by definition. By joining with God as fellow travelers, we sign on for something more like an explorer's venture into uncharted territory than a prepackaged sightseeing tour.

It's a pattern God's people know well. Abraham heard a call from God and wandered west, knowing only that a future of rich blessing awaited him and his descendants. Joseph was sold into slavery and taken where he didn't want to go, but he patiently worked with God until he found himself Pharaoh's deputy. Moses, minding his own business, heard God call him to take on the king and lead the Israelites out of slavery. They wandered in the wilderness, unsure of the way, for what must have felt like an eternity, but eventually their journey led to the Promised Land itself. And Jesus, God in human flesh, led his

followers on what seemed a deeply uncertain path —wandering from village to village, being rejected as often as embraced, enduring what appeared to be complete failure before it blossomed into resurrected life.

All of life is lived in real time, and the best we can do is live it faithfully — minute by minute, hour by hour, day by day.

And now, God's people of St. Andrew's find themselves on a journey toward new life as we rebuild, restore and renew our church. We'd like to have a precise itinerary. We'd like to have the course charted down to the last detail. We'd like to know how much we're going to spend on each project, and when the work will be done, and who will be doing it. All those details are coming into place, but they won't all be in place by the time we each make a commitment to this work. We're traveling in real time.

And as God's fellow travelers, we find ourselves in good company. Just ask Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Jesus and millions of disciples along the way. The details of the trip may weigh us down sometimes, particularly when the itinerary isn't as specific as we'd like. But the journey is always worth taking, because new life is always our God-given destination.

We acknowledge that God provides resources, and we manage them for the good of his kingdom. By combining these efforts, we are accomplishing in 10 weeks what normally would take 20 weeks.

# RESTORATION PROJECT 2010-2012

Take a brief look around the church, and it is easy to see peeling wallpaper, torn carpet, cracks in the exterior stonework and windows, water stains and aging mechanicals. We must protect and preserve our church home to carry on the legacy and ministry of St. Andrew's! Our building is a vitally important ministry tool that enables us to express God's love in our community.

A team of parishioners led by our Junior Warden that includes architects and builders has identified a long list of interior and exterior repairs with approximate costs. The team has categorized the repairs into four areas, which are shown to the right in the established order of priority.

Expenditures are being supervised by a certified public accountant that is independent of the Vestry, and stringent internal controls have been established to ensure that your generous contribution is spent the right way. One hundred percent of pledges made to the restoration campaign will be spent on restoration projects. Our goal is to complete all projects by the end of 2012.

# YOUR DECISION TO GIVE

Giving to the **Rebuild, Restore, Renew** Restoration and Stewardship campaign is an important decision. We realize your restoration gift may be one of the most significant charitable donations you make in your lifetime. Additionally, we are asking for a pledge that's over and above your regular giving for restoration so that we can continue the legacy, life and important ministries of the church. Thus, we encourage you to pray about your pledge before deciding what you intend to give. *We ask that you consider the following:*

**Recall the blessings God has given to you**, remembering that everything we have belongs to God, and our role is to be a good manager of his resources.

**Remember the impact that can be made** for God's Kingdom through your sacrificial gift. Our church has a unique calling to serve God in our community.

**Bear in mind that every gift**, regardless of size, is an important contribution to God's work through our church.

**Discuss the practical and spiritual implications** of your family's participation with all members of your family.

**Pray to discern what sacrifice God is asking** of you in this process. Pray also that God will give the Vestry and church staff wisdom and strength as they lead St. Andrew's in our daily ministry and through the restoration process.



Remember, all gifts to the **Rebuild, Restore, Renew** initiative are important. We would love to see 100 percent of our members and regular attendees support this effort. Giving to the church involves a sacrifice for everyone, and we thank you wholeheartedly for your generosity.

# Questions & Answers *about your decision to give*

## How much should I give to the annual ministry work of the church?

Our hope is that you will follow the teaching of the Apostle Paul (2 Cor. 9:6-8) and give generously to the Lord's work at St. Andrew's with a cheerful spirit, not reluctantly or under any pressure to give. Paul also tells us in 2 Corinthians 8:7 to excel in the grace of giving — just as we work to excel in other areas of our faith. So we encourage you to seek the Lord about what you would give and consider giving generously according to your means to God's work at St. Andrew's next year. The giving chart on page six may be helpful in providing a picture of how a monthly or weekly investment in God's work of 3, 5, or 7 percent would impact you and your family.

## How much should I give to the restoration project?

Because a gift to the restoration fund is a sacrificial gift over and above your regular giving, this, of course, is between you and God. We would ask, however, that you prayerfully consider giving at least 3 to 5 percent of your income to restoration each year for the next two years. You may find it helpful to use the accompanying chart to get a picture of what a gift of 3 or 5 percent of your income would mean over the course of two years. Additional giving options are also listed on the enclosed pledge card. Regardless of the amount you decide to give, all gifts to the *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* program are important and will help us to restore our house of worship.

## Are there other ways I can give to the restoration project?

Yes! Many people elect to give gifts of stock, mutual fund shares or other property which can then be used to support the restoration effort. You may also realize additional tax benefits by making gifts of property. If you would like to make this type of gift, please contact Nina Edwards, financial administrator, at 816-523-1602, ext. 111.

## When should I make my pledge to the Restoration and Annual Stewardship campaign?

Commitment Sunday for both the restoration and stewardship portions of the *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* campaign is November 21. Please bring your pledge card to worship on that day. If you will not be at church that day, you can use the envelope provided to mail your pledge card to the church, hand deliver your pledge to the church office or place your pledge card in the offering the week before. While you can begin making contributions immediately, the church welcomes your contributions when you are best able to begin fulfilling your pledge.

## When should I make my first *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* contributions?

Stewardship support donations for the *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* campaign can be made from January 1, 2011, to December 31, 2011. Gifts to the restoration project may be made from November 21, 2010, to November 20, 2012.

## How often should I make a contribution toward my restoration pledge?

How much you give and when you give is up to you. Many parishioners pay a portion of their pledge each week or month. Some pay on a quarterly or annual basis. Others make a one-time contribution. You can select a donation schedule that works best for you. The restoration portion of the *Rebuild, Restore, Renew* initiative giving period runs from November 2010 to November 2012.

# *A history of* ST. ANDREW'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH

**Rebuild, Restore, Renew** carries on the legacy of the people who established St. Andrew's nearly 100 years ago and built it up over the years. Were it not for their generosity, hard work and strong will, the building and parish life we cherish today would not exist.

This historical account is adapted from *The Spirit of St. Andrew's (1913-1963)*, published on the occasion of St. Andrew's 50th anniversary.

**1913** St. Andrew's held its first service on January 19 in the home of Rev. Charles Weed, Rector, and Mrs. Weed. Services moved a few weeks later to 59th and Brookside Boulevard, where they were held in a back room of Fred Wolferman's grocery. Later in 1913, the congregation built a small, white, one-room chapel that could seat 100 people.

**1922** St. Andrew's broke ground for the first church built at Wornall and Meyer on land acquired in 1916 for \$11,000 (\$177,000 today). The cost for building the new church was \$20,000 (\$270,000 today). The first service was Easter Day 1923.

**1931** Bishop Spencer laid the cornerstone of the second church being built at Wornall and Meyer. The first service took place on a rainy fall day — the roof leaked.

**1946** The first fund drive for the building we worship in today raised \$158,400 (\$1,050,000 today), four years before groundbreaking.

**1950** After more successful fund drives, the Vestry voted to begin construction of the new church. The estimated cost was \$525,000 (\$3,100,000 today). An accelerated fund drive was launched to raise the additional money needed.

**1953** St. Andrew's held its first service in our existing building on March 30.

**1973** St. Andrew's began a new fund drive to build the Jewell Room, bride's room, parish offices, library, undercroft, auxiliary room and Wornall Road entrance. Parishioners raised \$740,000 (\$2,100,000 today). Construction was completed in 1974.

**1990** St. Andrew's purchased HJs.

**2010** St. Andrew's launched a fund drive to raise \$1,250,000 to rebuild, restore and renew the nearly 60-year-old church building.

**2013** St. Andrew's will celebrate its 100th anniversary in a beautifully restored building that people for generations to come will be proud to call their church home.
